

The Bair Island Aquatic Center (BIAC) is a nonprofit community in Silicon Valley focused on human-powered water sports including rowing, sculling, paddling, and dragon boating.

History

- 1999 BIAC formed as 501(c)3 organization with a \$ 90K loan, repaid over 4 years
- 2002 Junior programs started. Serra High joins BIAC
 - -- Novice Adult program initiated
- 2004 -- California Dragon Boating joined BIAC
 - -- Norcal joins BIAC
- 2005 -- Stanford Kayaking joins BIAC
- 2007 Rebuilding Day: Webcor and Rebuilding Together BIAC brings facilities up to code
- 2008 New Use Permit and compliance inspections complete



BIAC: The Challenges

- Membership & Community outreach is limited
 - Due to lack of <u>Parking</u>
- Facilities are constrained
 - Lacking covered storage or social house
 - Due to water supply-fire sprinklers.
- Water are not usable during low tide,
 - Waterway needs dredging.
- Short Term Lease
 - Limited investment in facilities to minimal
